



Q. What is the start and end time each day at WPHS?

A. WPHS starts class each day at 8:25 a.m. and school ends daily at 3:00 p.m.

Q. Who is the principal? When can we meet this person?

The principal is Mrs. Brandi Haskins. She has served as the principal of Westview High School and La Joya Community High School. Mrs. Haskins will join the WPHS satellite office on January 7, 2019 at TUHS District Office at 9801 W. Van Buren St., Tolleson, AZ 85353.

Q. What grades are being offered the first year the school opens, then the second year it is open? When will WPHS have all four grades?

A. WPHS is set to open for the 2019-2020 school year with freshman and sophomore students only (grades 9-10); in 2020-2021, the school will accommodate freshman, sophomores and juniors (grades 9, 10, & 11); in 2021-2022, West Point High School will have its first graduating class, serving freshman, sophomores, juniors and seniors (grades 9, 10, 11 & 12).

Q. When and where are Future Freshman Nights and Parent Information Nights?

For Future Freshman Nights and Parent Information Nights, those will be scheduled during the Spring of 2019. The various locations will be announced in the near future.

Q. Is there a satellite location for WPHS now to get information and registration paperwork?

A. WPHS is currently at the Tolleson Union High School District Office, 9801 W. Van Buren St. It open daily 7:30 a.m. to 4: 00 p.m. to serve the public.

Q. What elementary schools feed directly into WPHS?

Collier, Littleton (north of Buckeye Rd.), Canyon Breeze, Rio Vista, Amberlea, Sheely Farms, Desert Oasis, PH Gonzales (section listed on map).

Q. Will English Language Learning classes be offered at WPHS?

Yes. We will have ELD courses available.

TRANSPORTATION

Q. Who is provided a bus to WPHS? What if I Open Enroll how is transportation impacted?

Students entering their sophomore year who also attended the Tolleson Union High School District in their freshman year, will be grandfathered until their cohort graduation. This means that if you lived in and attended La Joya, as an example, during your freshman year then transportation will continue to be provided to help you finish graduating at La Joya. All incoming freshman are expected to attend their home school based on the new boundaries. Students may always apply for open enrollment to attend any school in the district, however, transportation is typically not provided to open enrollment students.

Athletic Transfers:

Any sophomore student that currently attends a TUHSD high school and lives in the newly established West Point boundaries may transfer to West Point without any loss of AIA eligibility.

They will not be required to sit the first 50% of the regular season games due to the transfer.
